### Copyright Infringement

Unauthorized reproduction of copyright material is prohibited and constitutes infringement that carries the risk of civil and criminal liability to both the University and student, as set out in Title 17 United States Code Chapter 5: <http://www.copyright.gov/title17/92chap5.html>.

### Intellectual Property

5.1 At the heart of any academic or research endeavor resides the concept of intellectual property.
